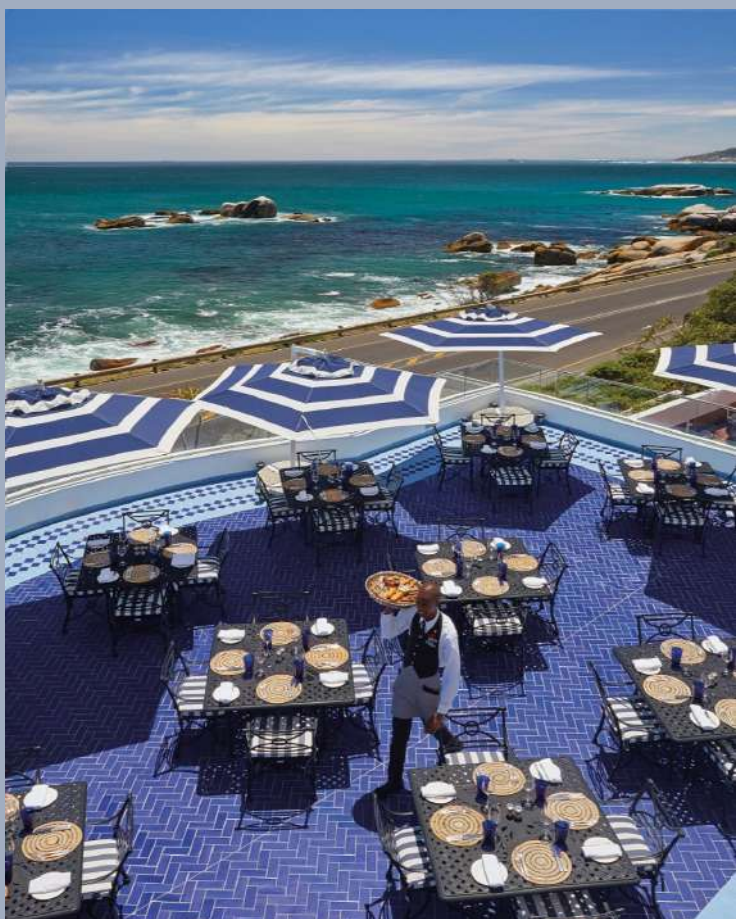
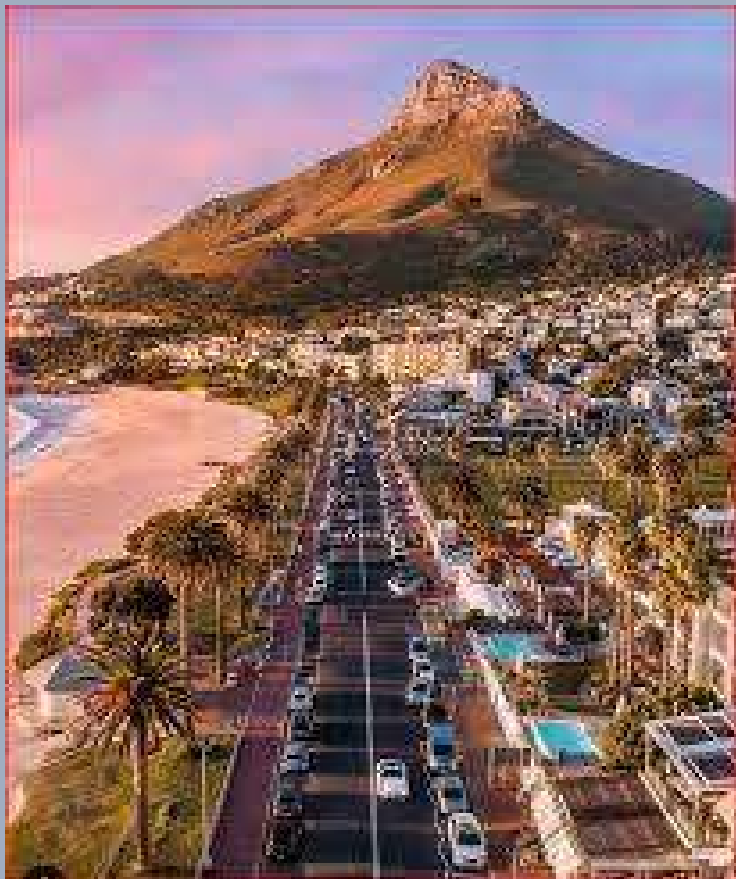

DETAILED ITINERARY

About the Camps Bay

- First stop is the Camps Bay area known for its white beaches and spectacular views.
- View the 12 Apostles, a beautiful range of twelve mountains including the western back view of the Table Mountain when in Camps Bay. View Camps Bay beach, Cape Town's own version of St. Tropez in France. Clear view of the Camps Bay, the most beautiful and expensive Seaside residential area in South Africa.

About Chapmans Peak

- The most beautiful drive in Cape Town, similar to Amalfi Coast drive in Italy or the Pacific Highway 101 in California. We will stop here for a bit of course for some picture moments before moving on to our next stop.

About Simons Town

- Explore Simons Town in Cape Town for some coastal surprises. Simons Town is home to the Naval Base Simon's Town, the South African Navy's largest base. While here though you will get to explore the great shores and nearby shops.
- Simons Town also happens to be home to Boulders Beach. Here you will visit 1 of the only 2 places in Africa where you can view "Africa Jack Ass" Penguins in their natural habitat. Open for pictures and explorations who would not want to see the Penguins of Africa.

About Cape Point and Cape of Good Hope

- Cape point is found on the furthest mountain tip of the Cape Peninsula, a mountainous and scenic landform that runs north-south for about thirty kilometers at the extreme southwestern tip of the African continent in South Africa
- While at Cape Point its recommended that one takes a funicular or hike up to the Cape Point Lighthouse and enjoy some breath-taking views of the mountain range and Atlantic Ocean.
- There after we make a short trip not far from Cape Point to the CAPE OF GOOD HOPE: The most southern western point of the African Continent, the tip of Africa.
- While we are here, we will continue to explore the most beautiful scenery that is found in Cape Town. Nothing is quite like a visit to the Cape of Good Hope.

About the Stellenbosch

- First stop will be Stellenbosch which is known as the Wine Capital of South Africa. Stellenbosch is surrounded by the vineyards of the Cape Winelands and the mountainous nature reserves of Simonsberg and Jonkershoek.
- Stellenbosch is the second oldest town in South Africa and is one that holds great culture, art and most importantly wineries.
- As our first stop we will enjoy wine tasting at this wine capital and enjoy the scenery while at it.
- You will leave this place feeling as sophisticated as the wine tasting that will happen at Stellenbosch.

About Paarl

- Paarl will be our final Winelands Tour adventure town. It is the third-oldest City and European settlement in the Republic of South Africa and the largest town in the Cape Winelands.
- Paarl takes its name from the huge granite outcrop that stands proudly on the crest of Paarl Mountain. The town which is only a 45-minute drive from Cape Town was founded in 1687 and has a rich cultural and historical heritage.
- The birth of Afrikaans as the world's youngest language is celebrated by the iconic Afrikaans Language Monument that stands prominently on the southern slopes of Paarl Mountain.
- The town has many fine examples of Georgian, Victorian, Edwardian and Cape Dutch buildings that compete for space with a wide variety of fine restaurants and coffee shops spread out along the twelve kilometer-long Main Street.
