

DETAILED ITINERARY

Explore Robben Island

- After being dropped off at the Nelson Mandela Gateway, be whisked away on a ferry boat all the way to Robben Island for approximately 3.5 hours to and from Robben Island.
- While in Robben Island you will get to experience history as it unfolds right in front of you of all the great men who have been held in Robben Island.
- The tour itself includes visits to the graveyard where people died of leprosy, the Lime Quarry, Robert Sobukwe House, the Bluestone Quarry, the army and navy bunkers as well as the Maximum-security prison not forgetting the jail cell which Nelson Mandela spent his time.

Parliament Buildings

- The Parliament buildings are beautifully designed historic buildings that include what is known as the Houses of Parliament.
- Built in 1885 the Parliament Building are similar to the White House in America holding great history within its walls and a great picture-perfect backdrop.

About Slave Auction Tree and Slave Museum

- As its name suggests we will visit the Slave Auction Tree in the Cape Town City where auctioning of slaves took place.
- The Slave Auction Tree was an old fir tree that was cut down in 1916. The site is now an octagonal memorial erected on a traffic island in remembrance of the very large number of slaves that were said to be sold under the tree.

About the District 6 Museum

- Atrocities are to be remembered so we do not forget, and so that history does not repeat itself, this can be said about the district 6 Museum in the city of Cape Town.
- District 6 is most famous for being the former inner-city residential area in Cape Town, South Africa.
- Over 60,000 of its inhabitants were forcibly removed during the 1970s by the apartheid regime forcing people to leave behind their entire lives.
- · We will also do a drive by the Old Parliament Hall

About the Jewish Museum and Holocaust Centre

- The next place we will visit is one that carries with it religious views and remembrance at the SA Jewish Museum as well as the Holocaust Centre.
- Built as an extension of South Africa's oldest synagogue, the South African Jewish Museum is a beautifully designed space created to showcase and remember cultural history of Jews, Jewish life and Judaism in general.
- The Holocaust Centre which will also be part of the trip was
 founded in 1999 with the aim at working towards creating a
 more caring and just society in which human rights and
 diversity are respected and valued. The museum tells the
 stories of many through exhibitions, events and workshops
 and aim to commemorate the victims and survivors of the
 Nazi regime and the numerous genocides that happened
 before and since the Holocaust.
