DETAILED ITINERARY

About Mandela House

- The Nelson Mandela House or Mandela House is the house located on Vilakazi Street Orlando West Soweto in South Africa and was the residential house where Nelson Mandela lived from 1946 up until 1962 with his family.
- Located on 8115 at the corner of Vilakazi street and Ngakane street this house is not far from the Tutu house which was also the residential home of Archbishop Desmond Tutu.
- This is also the place which Nelson Mandela returned to after being released from prison in 1990.
- This house is a true depiction of Mandela and his life with his family. Since 1999, the home has been declared a National Heritage Site as a monument into the long-fought struggle against the apartheid regime showcasing that even in the smallest and insignificant of places, light and courage can be found.



About the Hector Pieterse Museum

- Hector Pieterse Museum will give us some inspiration on the language of resistance in the uprising of 1976 across Soweto.
- The Hector Pieterse Museum is located in Orlando West in Soweto, two blocks away from where Hector Pieterse was shot and killed on 16 June 1976.
- The museum is named in his honour, and covers the events of the anti-apartheid uprising of Soweto and the battle for anti-apartheid laws of having Afrikaans compulsory in all schools across South Africa
